

I have read the boarding requirements and understand the hospital's policies.

- 1. All animals must be current on all vaccinations.
- 2. All animals must be free of external parasites (ex. ticks, fleas, etc.), or they will be treated at owner's expense.
- 3. Pet hotel "rates" are charged per calendar day and not per night. There is a check out time of 12pm and there is no charge if pet goes home before noon. Full payment is due at drop off.
- 5. Should circumstance arise that my pet remains unclaimed after the pick up date as stated without notice of extended stay, I understand that a written notice will be mailed to the address on file. Fifteen (15) days after such written notice and the animal is not redeemed, the pet is considered abandoned and will be property of AAA Animal Hospital to do with as we deem fit which includes being euthanized.
- 6. I understand the risk of boarding. I assume all responsibility including financial responsibility for injury or escape and release AAA Animal Hospital from any responsibility. I understand the risk of KENNEL COUGH, your pet should receive the vaccination 1 month prior to boarding, if my pet is vaccinated less then they are not fully protected and I do not hold AAA Animal Hospital liable.

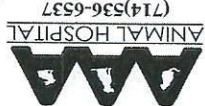

Thank you for Choosing AAA Animal Hospital to board your pets with us!!
Boarding your pets in a doctor-supervised pet "hotel" is a good choice. Since the boarding "hotel" is not home, it is important that you understand how pets could respond to being away from home and family.

- Each pet is kept separate in a 6x4 run unless family members request that they board together. They are walked twice daily. Cats are kept in a 24x24 cat condo that can be extended.
- Each pet is fed by owners request.
- Heating and air conditioning are provided as well as towels and blankets at night.
- A veterinarian is available 7 days a week.
- All pets must be current on flea control and vaccines.

Household pets are creatures of habit. While adapting to boarding certain amount of "separation stress" may occur.

- They may assimilate food differently, resulting in weight gain or loss.
- Sometimes they may develop temporary diarrhea. This can be treated with the proper medication.
- They may develop behavioral changes. They might chew on their blanket or bed, soiling in the run, licking areas of the body (causing sores).
- Underlying conditions may become active.

What to expect when picking up your pet.

- When dropping off your pet you will be required to have bath on the day of pick up, while your pet is here they may get what is called "kennel odor". Kennel sanitation is the highest priority for us, but some pets soil their cages and or lay in soiled area. Cats when boarding like to lay in the kitty litter box. It only takes a minute for this to happen.
- Flea control. All pets boarding are required to be on a flea control. They are boarding individual runs that are cleaned and sanitized daily. When pets are taken on their daily walks it is a possibility for them to pick up fleas in our surrounding areas. **Flea control is strongly recommended all year around.**

- Your pet could have been within "incubation period" of an infectious disease when brought in. Signs of disease do not develop for several days after exposure to an infectious agent. Even though you assume the pet is healthy and current on vaccines, it is impossible to detect many problems until a pet starts to show clinical signs. Vaccines, at times can only be 80% effective. **Any changes in their normal routine can result in "stress" which can weaken the immune system.**
